## Refugee Sponsorship Program

Westminster's Council has enthusiastically endorsed participation in the Refugee Sponsorship Program. Our history of volunteering and providing support in a time of need is again before us, as a church and as a community partner.

Sponsoring a Refugee or a Refugee Family is a large responsibility, but with plenty of helpers aligned into areas of personal strength, we can share, learn and grow together with our choice of commitments. We will lighten responsibilities by spreading them amongst a number of committees. These committees would communicate with an oversight group consisting of representatives of the 4 churches (Brooklin United, Brooklin Unitarian Universalist, Kingsview United and Westminster United) involved in the project.

Committee makeup is based on input received from other Churches who have sponsored refugees and have willingly shared their experience and wisdom. We would look for volunteers for the following areas:

- Fundraising – Corporate and Community
- Publicity and Communications
- Housing
- ESL and Tutoring
- Transportation
- Job Search
- Skills Upgrading, Life Skills, Canadian Culture
- Support Network
- Technical Training
- Community Liaison



Volunteer involvement will be at different times depending on your area of interest. Some committees will be very busy initially, and others will become active much later.

In addition to seeking volunteers within our churches, a public meeting will be held Wednesday, October 19, 2016 at 7:00 PM at the Whitby Central Library. The public meeting will allow us to share information and encourage additional community volunteers. The Library has graciously stepped forward as co-sponsor of this meeting.

While we are still in the planning stages of this venture, inquiries on how to make financial contributions have already been received. Cheques can be made payable to **Westminster United Church** and clearly marked **Refugee Sponsorship** where they will be designated for that purpose only and a charitable receipt provided. **“Why I Give”** – this is an interesting, thought provoking statement. One key message in numerous articles on this topic is that people give to a church because they believe in its mission - they see how the church has changed people’s lives. How has Westminster changed people’s lives? Here are a few examples of how I believe Westminster has and continues to change people’s lives:

- ◆ Through prayers, support and caring for others, specifically the prayer shawls, the Divorce Care and Stroke Recovery groups, the Prayer Team and the Friendly Visitors outreach to individuals who are ill or shut-ins.
- ◆ Mission & Services – contributing \$35,000 in offerings in the past 19 months.
- ◆ St. Vincent’s Kitchen – 120+ hot meals are served to less fortunate folks, on the 1<sup>st</sup> Wednesday of each month by the Westminster team. That’s over 1200+ hot meals through the course of a year, just from Westminster.
- ◆ Our Foodbank – last year over 322 individuals availed themselves of our foodbank offerings – these families will not go hungry.
- ◆ Christmas Food Hampers and Christmas Gifts – nothing wrenches at one’s heart more than seeing the teary eyes and quivering voice of a parent when gifts or a Christmas hamper are delivered to them – “there will be a Christmas” they must be thinking.
- ◆ Our Mitten and Sock trees – in the winter months, the hands and feet of young tykes are covered with the beautiful, warm mittens and comfy socks from our trees.
- ◆ The UCW and Foodman Group’s generous contributions – the socializing and camaraderie are a bi-product of the tireless efforts of both of these energetic groups. Their generous offerings to Westminster are most appreciated.
- ◆ The Small Group activities that are offered where folks can get together and share ideas, socialize and explore their faith more fully.
- ◆ Becoming an Affirming church – a huge accomplishment that offers inclusion to all. As an aside, we’ve been so successful that even some local 4-legged critters, aka racoons, apparently heard about our Affirming status and have been trying to become part of Westminster, literally.

Westminster is a great community to be part of and we should all be very proud of our generous donations - be they time, talent or financial resources, and what they enable us to achieve.
