CELEBRATING PASSOVER

As Christians, we are part of an Abrahamic tradition which includes Judaism and Islam, the three monotheistic religions that profess belief in one God. Together, representatives of these three religious faiths are currently working to build bridges and gain friendship among Jews, Christians and Muslims. One goal is to educate and define a common purpose and seek a common mind, particularly with regard to pluralism and common ethical premises of a civil society. (reference: The Abrahamic Community Program; https://www.chautauquafoundation.org/index.php/religion).

With this in mind, the Parish Mosaic Committee highlights Passover (Pesach), the Jewish holiday which begins on the night of April 10th and lasts for eight days. This holiday commemorates the liberation of the Israelites from slavery in Egypt and marks the birth of the Jewish people as a nation led by Moses over 3000 years ago.

Passover is as much a celebration of spiritual freedom as the physical liberation from slavery. The highlight of Passover is the observance of the Seder, a unique ceremony performed on the first two evenings of Passover. At the Seder, different symbolic foods are prepared and eaten (e.g.matzah, charoset, bitter herbs, hard-boiled egg), the story of the departure from Egypt is re-told, songs are sung and special prayers are said. And so to our Jewish friends, as you celebrate this important festival, we say "Shalom and Happy Passover"

BRIDGE TO A NEW HOME

BRIDGE TO A NEW HOME refugee committee has accepted responsibility for sponsorship of a gentleman from Burma - also known as Myanmar. 'Sut' is currently in Malaysia; he is a single gentleman and he speaks a language called 'Chin'.

We are truly looking forward to his arrival in the near future. Can you help us prepare?

Support is needed in 2 areas: Housing and Transportation...

HOUSING for Sut may be a challenging task given current housing situations. We are appealing for your help in locating affordable shelter for a single person. Please contact a member of the committee if you are aware of a potential unit.

TRANSPORTATION for Sut will be extensive and require a small group of volunteers to help him to a variety of locations, such as English lessons, medical appointments, Ajax Welcome Centre, grocery shopping, banking, etc. We ask for your help during his first year in our community. These needs will be weekdays, weeknights and weekends.

TRANSLATION support for Sut will be essential and the committee has been successful in finding a volunteer interpreter. The difficulty in locating an interpreter intensified when we learned that Sut speaks Chin! This is not a common language and is limited to the Chin State of Burma and a small part of neighbouring India. 99% of the Chin state is Christian. They have experienced persecution in the past from the Burmese Government and the army.

We learned this through a meeting with Sang, the interpreter living in Toronto, who is from Burma and fluent in Chin. Sang is very enthusiastic about helping us, but we will have to respect his 9-5 workday. He has volunteered a backup interpreter who lives in Kitchener. Sang told us that there are only 8 Chin families in Toronto and 1,000 Chin people in Kitchener. He spent time informing us of Burmese history and emphasized his desire to help us as much as possible. The committee believes that they could not have found a better resource. Just AWESOME and a "call" answered.

LENTEN LABYRINTH JOURNEY


"a spiritual journey of renewal and reflection"


