
Weekly Worship Service each Sunday at 10:30 a.m. February 3, 2019

Why have a Scouting and Guiding Service?

In the month of February Scouts and Guides around the world, from Beavers to Rovers and Sparks to Rangers, celebrate the births of their founders, Lord Robert Baden-Powell (1857–1941) and his wife, Lady Olave Baden-Powell (1889–1977). Although not as many churches are involved with these organizations in present day, there are still some that are partnered with the Scouts and Guides through the act of holding a Charter. Holding a Charter signifies a partnership with these groups to focus on helping young people. Westminster has held a Charter for the Scouts for 23 years. In today's service, we acknowledge the contributions of the Baden-Powells and all those who have been part of these organizations.


