#### Multi-Faith Pride Worship Service: Sunday June 2 , 11:00am—12:00pm

Westminster is once again involved in the Durham Multi-Faith Pride Worship Service. Please join us for a service that celebrates diversity, acceptance, inclusivity and love. The Worship Service will take place in Ajax at the soccer fields located at Harwood Ave. and Falby Court. There is ample parking at the Ajax Community Centre.

#### Durham Pride Parade: Sunday June 2, 12:00pm—2:00pm

This is literally our chance to "Walk the Talk" in support of the LGBTQ community. The Parade route this year is in the Northbound lanes of Harwood Avenue, starting from Falby Court and ending at Arbour Park, behind the Ajax Public Library. The parade will be followed by music, dance and refreshments. All are invited to walk with us in the parade or to cheer us on from the sidelines.

#### Youth Pride Event: Saturday June 8, 2:00pm – 4:00pm.

## An update from the Climate Disruption Mitigation Committee (CDMC)

At the *Time to Choose* documentary film night, we invited attendees to suggest topics/ initiatives/ project ideas for our committee to consider in planning future actions to mitigate climate disruption. Below are the ideas that came forward.

#### Topics of interest for future events:

- home renovations to make your home more energy efficient
- gardening
- how to live zero waste

#### Ideas for church initiatives:

- have an eco-fair (invite vendors of eco-friendly products and have a seed swap)
- put a solar roof on the church
- plant trees on Westminster property
- plant a butterfly garden at the church
- start a seed bank

#### Ideas for actions the community can take:

- write our municipal and regional governments about Durham declaring a climate emergency
- start a food rescue program in Durham to give away food from grocery stores which otherwise would be food waste

Think about what you do not want to lose through climate change and add it to the tree. # **United Church Women (UCW)**



Our purpose is "to unite the women of the congregation for the total mission of the church and to provide a medium through which we may express our loyalty and devotion to Jesus Christ in Christian witness, study, fellowship and service." This is an interest and service group to which all women of the congregation are invited to belong or simply attend meetings.

We are part of the national organization which operates at Presbyterial (Lakeridge Presbyterial), Regional (East Central Ontario Regional Council) and National (National Consultation) levels. Our president and other members are active at the Presbyterial level. Many attend the Presbyterial quarterly programs/events. These are enjoyable occasions of education, stimulation and fellowship within a larger group of diverse women.

The Westminster UCW meets the first Monday of the month from October to June. In September we meet on the Tuesday following Labour Day at 6:30pm in the Founders' Room

where the women: participate in opportunities of growth and fellowship, collect offerings and distribute the monies earned according to our annual budget, organize various upcoming functions such as caterings and fund raisers.

For larger activities, we call on help from the whole congregation.

All monies raised are given to programs at Westminster, projects of the wider church or charities in our local community.

## Come one, come all... It's PICNIC TIME!


Sunday, June 9<sup>th</sup>


