Already and not yet.



Easter Flowers

Every Easter our Westminster sanctuary is decorated with beautiful spring flowers. The Wellness Committee, assisted by our Ministry Team, Office Staff, Friendly Visitors and the many people who make monetary donations to Westminster, purchase flowers in memory of loved ones or to honour friends.

Any amount remaining from donations goes into the General Revenue for Westminster and the full amount appears on your tax receipt.

With this longtime outreach tradition, we express our joy that Christ has Risen. Following the Easter service the flowers are distributed with blessings from Westminster to members and friends who are unable to attend due to illness or incapacity or who are in hospital or long term care facilities. A list of names has been compiled from Ministry and Office Staff and the Friendly Visitors Team. If there are flowers left over on Easter Sunday they can be delivered to someone who is newly identified and needs remembrance.

- ...that if the church parking lot is full and the 'grassy knoll' is inaccessible, you can park on the road on the west side of Garrard?









The Christian Education Committee purchased the following books for the library:




Victor loves his pink (accident-in-the-washing-machine) pyjamas. But not everyone does. His father and sister think pink is just for girls. But Victor knows that lots of wonderful things are pink – like strawberry ice cream, bubble gum, and walruses basking in the sun – and they're not just for girls. What will happen when Victor outgrows his pink pyjamas and needs a new pair? This engaging and humorous book explores what it is like to make choices that are different from the cultural norm.



When Tommy's dog, Paddy, dies, Tommy is sad. He doesn't want another dog. He just wants Paddy. Then an angel visits Tommy. The angel reminds Tommy that he was a great dog owner, and that Paddy loved him very much – as much as Tommy loved Paddy. Tommy finds that his heart can hold even more than his enormous love for Paddy.



What Jesse wants most is a guitar. But it seems beyond his reach. His mom can't afford to buy him one, but she gives him an ocarina instead. Jesse is grateful and disappointed at the same time, so he goes out for a walk. Along the way he meets others who need his help. He gives what he can and learns that we can't always predict the results of our actions. Author Laura Alary's charming story is full of unexpected twists and is based on a well-loved tale from India about giving (and receiving).



It's the middle of the night and Naomi runs down the hall to her parents' bedroom screaming, "EEEEEE!" There's an alligator in her pillow and she needs mom and dad to make it go away. Over a few nights, Naomi's parents groggily try different approaches to rid Naomi's pillow of the alligator, but in the end it is Naomi who comes up with a way to face her scary nocturnal visitor. Naomi's parents gently and sleepily allow her to explore her fear of the alligator in a supportive way that is neither sentimental or harshly dismissive. What can be seen as a troubling and upsetting event (for both parents and child) is sensitively and realistically dealt with by a deft and light hand.



When Jeremiah starts kindergarten, he is good at learning lots of things. But no matter how hard he tries, he can't seem to make the letter "e." And his name has two "e's" in it! Author David Giuliano and illustrator Meghan Irvine team up to create an engaging and humourous look at facing the ongoing challenges of life. There is always something new to learn, including how to listen to the small voice inside that encourages us to keep trying — with surprising results.
