Update from the Stewardship/Finance Committee on November 2019 Offerings//

For the month of November, offerings were \$20,839 vs. target of \$31,095 (shortfall of \$10,706). November 2018 offerings were \$28,552. Based on offerings so far this year, the target goal of a balanced budget for the year will not be achieved.

Mission & Service offerings to the end of November are \$4,445 greater than the same time last year.

It is our hope that this evening will provide you with an opportunity in a supportive community and among caring friends to be reminded that the Christmas story contains a message of hope no matter our circumstances.




