ALL: We praise You, God.

One: As one of us He came, at first a tender infant,

And yet He was betrayed and nailed to a cross.

One: But He was lifted from the grave and restored to life,

that He might be with us and we with Him.

Alive for evermore!

Therefore, with all the saints, and with angels in the heavens, our hearts beat with happiness and we say:

ALL: Holy, Holy, Holy Lord, God of power and might. Heaven and earth are full of Your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord.

One: On the night before Jesus died, He had supper with His disciples;

He took bread; thanked You, as we have thanked You; broke the bread; and gave the bread to His friends, saying, "Take this, all of you, and eat it. This is My body, given for you.

Each time you do this, remember Me."

After supper He took the wine; thanked You for it, and passed a cup of wine to His friends, saying, "This cup is the new promise God has made with you in My blood. Each time you do this and drink from this cup, remember Me."

Remembering His death and celebrating His resurrection, we await with hope His coming again to bring peace and justice to the earth.

Concerned about energy efficiency? Here are some helpful ideas ...

One person contributes as much heat as a 100 watt heater: so invite your friends over!

In the kitchen: your refrigerator and freezer are more energy efficient when they are full. Use water and ice cubes to fill up the space. Cook in quantity: when you bake, keep both racks full.

Small appliances such as a slow cooker, bread maker and pressure cooker are considerably more efficient than their larger equivalents.

Other Receipts included:


*\$6,000 additional funds from the UCW in December (in addition to the \$4,000 received in June)
