

Wills and Estate Planning – A personal reflection...



After months of learning about and then presenting our 'Wills and Estate Planning' info session this past May, I began to realize the important message embedded in the United Church's "Called to be the Church - The Journey".

I had a chance to reflect on how much my parents, grandparents and those before impacted my understanding of what the United Church, over the past 100 years, did to prepare me in becoming a Christian.

By building on its past history, both messed up and innovative, (totally my words \odot), I understood the important role that the missionaries played, in a faraway place like Trinidad and Tobago, to a small 5 year old girl in a TGIT group (Trinidad and Tobago Girls in Training). That young child from the West Indies was born to East Indian parents, with some French ancestry, whose great, great grandparents were indentured labourers from India, 'dropped off' in Guadalupe and Jamaica and who eventually got to Trinidad again by boat!!

Without sources of funding, the missionaries could not build the churches or the schools that helped to nurture me. In fact, without funding, many scholars would not have been able to migrate to Canada to pursue theological studies. And wonderfully speaking, many returned to Trinidad as ordained ministers who continued the work started by the missionaries.

Hence, for these and many other reasons, the Church's "Give to the Centennial Legacy Campaign" is underway, to ask and to inspire us to designate a legacy gift to ensure the church's "vitality to embrace the next 100 years while honouring the past, celebrating the present and looking towards the future" (UCC site).

And there we were talking about your wills and estate planning and helping you to make informed decisions to include Westminster or the United Church in your planning. Are you following the Journey with me so far?

Then **on June 8**th, coincidentally, Pentecost Sunday, I, like many others, had the privilege of watching the live service from St John's as the United Church celebrated its 100th Anniversary -- heralded as an opportunity to honour the past while looking towards the future ... being DEEP, BOLD AND DARING.

And **on June 17**th, a few of us attended a day-long leadership gathering hosted by the East Central Ontario Regional Council (ECORC) in Belleville, entitled "Holding a Vision for the Future". We heard about the state of the church today and the trajectory of where we could be in 10 years, and especially the need to work collaboratively to impact, improve and shape the future. This was referred to as: Deep, Bold and Daring Towards 2035.

So here I am "back to the future". Sometimes the Journey is circular, sometimes it is linear, sometimes it's up and down, and sometimes, especially for me, it means taking a pause to look both ways before deciding to turn left OR right. We never know how someone's bequest can impact someone else's journey.
